<ul> <li>Ensure thorough cleaning of undercarriage, engine bay, and wheel wells.</li> <li>Remove all soil, seeds, or organic matter.</li> <li>Consider professional steam-cleaning to meet biosecurity standards.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Step 6 - Final Inspection</li> <li>&amp; Handover</li> <li>Verify all documentation is complete and accessible.</li> <li>Lock doors and secure spare tires, tools, and equipment.</li> <li>Ensure vehicle is in drivable condition unless declared non-running.</li> </ul>
Step 3 – Remove Personal	Take a <b>final set of photos</b> before handover.
Items & Loose Accessories  Remove all personal belongings (documents, electronics, tools, luggage).  Detach or secure loose parts (roof racks, spoilers, trims).  Check that nothing remains in glove box, boot, or seats.	<ul> <li>Extra Tips</li> <li>Schedule vehicle delivery to port early to avoid delays.</li> <li>Confirm insurance coverage for transit.</li> <li>Review destination country regulations if exporting.</li> <li>Keep emergency contact info for your RoRo</li> </ul>
